Goggin gave an in-depth and captivating insight into the sport,

his approach, and what he has learnt while on tour.

Topics covered included training programs, what it's like to tour with two young children and the new drug policy for golfers.

He also gave us details of the Mathew Goggin Junior Golf Foundation which he aims to promote the game to young Tasmanians and encourage those who aspire to play at a world class level.

The students were able to speak with Goggin for an hour, and were impressed by his cheerful and friendly attitude and comprehensive answers.
