Bird house bonanza takes technology to new heights

SCIENCE teacher Kevin Welch has taken technology to a whole new level at Emmanuel Christian School.

Mr Welch came up with a plan for Grade 8 students to build bird houses to encourage medium-sized parrots such as the colourful rosella or the swift parrot to nest and mate within the school grounds.

The bird houses will repel predators and let the parrots live in peace.

The students have also attached little cameras to the bird houses, enabling them to study the birds' mysterious life cycle.

In the future Mr Welch wants to put the footage on to the internet to encourage other schools and the

public to embrace this idea and try it themselves. This will hopefully generate interest and passion in the students of the school.

The school received a \$550 Landcare grant to buy materials for the design, including plywood and the cameras.

Students painted their bird houses brown with a special tech-

nique that made the refuges look like bark. They learned many skills, including woodwork, painting and using technology.

Staff and students are now eagerly waiting to see if the birds will nest. So far the building of the bird houses is going to plan, and soon the students will be able to see the results of their labour.
