He said the school had grown dramatically over the years as had the size of the local community.

"We now have more than 450 enrolled students," he said.

"They participate in wonderful class and curricular activities and none of this could happen without the enthusiasm of the children, the support of the community and the dedication of all the staff.

"It really is a privilege to be principal of this fine school."

Mr Brown said during Term 2 the students celebrated Book Week.
