

In fact, each of the 1200 "children" represented a child that dies every hour due to poverty.

That's the whole of Rose Bay High gone in just over 30 minutes.

June 29 was Rose Bay's RU MAD Day? (Are You Making a Difference Day). RU MAD Day combined a free dress day, an assembly which focused on the Oaktree Foundation and informative activities about poverty.

Each student cut out two paper children which were added to the chain.

That night students also held their school social with the theme "Make Poverty History".

All the activities saw students raise \$2142 for the Oaktree Foundation while promoting awareness about poverty.
